Al Rayyan School Home School Agreement

We, the Management and Teachers at Al-Rayyan School will:

Learning Environment:

- Provide your child with good standard of Islamic education, implemented through a balanced and interactive curriculum.
- Ensure that your child learns to read the Quran while he/she is at school.
- Ensure that our learning environment is stimulating and challenging.
- Celebrate your child's achievements.
- Care for your child's safety and wellbeing by observation and listening to them.
- Provide a healthy and happy atmosphere at school.
- Teach your child to develop a positive attitude to one another, regardless of gender, race, culture, belief, values, age and need.
- Encourage your child to become an active member within our community and help them to see that they can have an impact on the world around them.
- Keep you informed about the progress of your child, celebrating their strengths and explaining how we can support them in their areas for development.

Communication and Homework:

- Provide information to you about our school, including relevant policies, meetings, activities, newsletters and open days.
- Set differentiated and achievable homework to extend the curriculum and provide the opportunity for independent learning.
- Send weekly Homework emails.

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I, the Parent/Carer will:

Learning Environment:

- Make sure that my child will arrive at school by 9:45 a.m. and is collected at 1:00 p.m.
- Make sure that my child is wearing suitable, Islamic/ weather appropriate clothing.
- Girls are expected to have headscarves for the Quran and Salah times.

Communication and Support:

- Let the school know of any concerns or worries that may be affecting my child's learning, behaviour or ability to do homework.
- Support the school by encouraging my child to develop a positive attitude towards our diverse, multicultural community.
- Attend meetings with my child's teacher and other staff, aiming to be positive and productive, working towards moving my child on in their learning.
- Support and work with the school to ensure that the behaviour management policies of the school are maintained, particularly with my child.
- Discuss any concerns with the school, as it is much healthier to work out solutions together and move on.
- Read all information sent home as this gives important details of relevant policies, meetings, activities, newsletters and open days.
- Make sure the school has up to date contact information (phone numbers, address and email addresses).
- Pay the school fees promptly at beginning of each of the three terms.
- Support the school when fundraising and organising activities for the benefit of a variety of causes and also our school.
- Drive and Park my vehicle considerately, respecting the rights and safety of other road users and school neighbours.
- Behave decently in Islamic way and not use any rude/disrespectful language when dealing with any member of staff / fellow parents/ children within and/or outside the school premises.

Homework

- Support the school by making sure that homework tasks are completed and returned on time.
- Try to enhance my child's learning at home on a daily basis.
